**150. Corr Nomination.** Confirmation of President Reagan's nomination of Edwin G. Corr of Oklahoma to be ambassador to El Salvador. Confirmed 89-8; R 42-8; D 47-0 (ND 33-0, SD 14-0), July 16, 1985. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**151. Ridgway Nomination.** Confirmation of President Reagan's nomination of Rozanne L. Ridgway of the District of Columbia to be assistant secretary of state for European and Canadian affairs. Confirmed 88-9; R 42-8; D 46-1 (ND 33-0, SD 13-1), July 16, 1985. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**152. Burt Nomination.** Confirmation of President Reagan's nomination of Richard R. Burt of the District of Columbia to be ambassador to West Germany. Confirmed 88-10; R 44-7; D 44-3 (ND 32-1, SD 12-2), July 16, 1985. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**153. S 408. Small Business Administration Authorizations, Fiscal 1986-88.** Bumpers, D-Ark., amendment to the Weicker, R-Conn., substitute, to strike the provision of the substitute barring farmers from receiving disaster loans from the Small Business Administration. Rejected 45-52; R 5-45; D 40-7 (ND 27-6, SD 13-1), July 16, 1985. A "nay" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**154. S 408. Small Business Administration Authorizations, Fiscal 1986-88.** Moynihan, D-N.Y., amendment to the Weicker, R-Conn., substitute, to establish a pilot program to sell to private banks loans from the Farmers Home Administration worth \$10 billion in each of the three years. Rejected 24-73; R 1-49; D 23-24 (ND 21-12, SD 2-12), July 16, 1985.

**155. S 408. Small Business Administration Authorizations, Fiscal 1986-88.** Passage of the bill, as amended by the Weicker, R-Conn., substitute, to authorize \$1.66 billion in fiscal 1986-88 for programs of the Small Business Administration, and \$228 million in direct loans and \$9.25 billion in guaranteed loans in fiscal 1986-88. The bill would also eliminate most direct loans to businesses and loans for non-physical disasters. Passed 94-3; R 48-2; D 46-1 (ND 32-1, SD 14-0), July 16, 1985. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position. (The Weicker substitute previously had been adopted by voice vote.)

**156. S 43. Line-Item Veto.** Quayle, R-Ind., motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on the Quayle motion to proceed to the consideration of the bill to give the president power to veto individual spending items by requiring that appropriations bills be split by paragraph or section into separate bills before being sent to the White House. Motion rejected 57-42; R 45-7; D 12-35 (ND 9-24, SD 3-11), July 18, 1985. A three-fifths majority vote (60) of the total Senate is required to invoke cloture. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.
