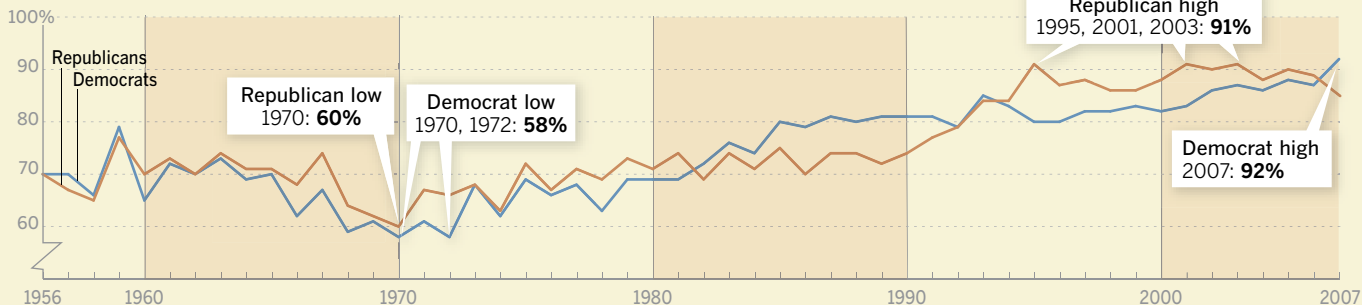


All-Time High for House Democrats

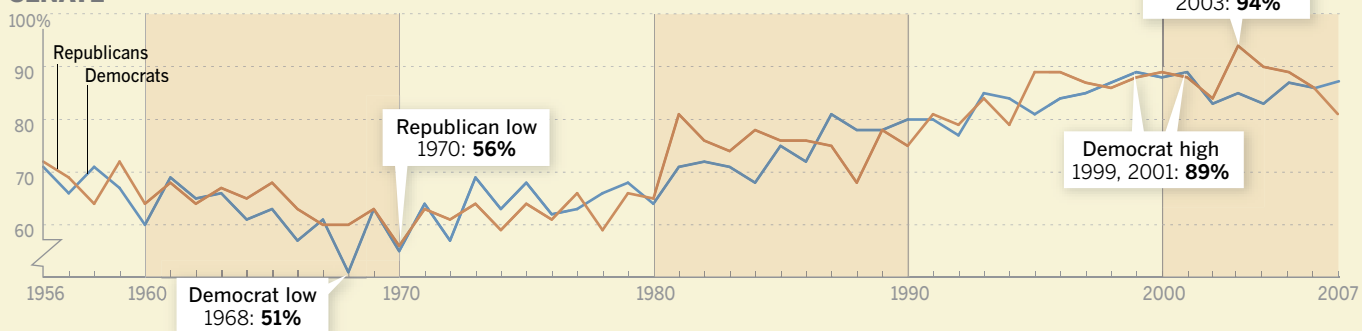
House Democrats were more unified than ever in 2007, voting with their party's majority 92 percent of the time, on average. That beat the House Democrats' previous high of 88 percent in 2005, as well as the House GOP high of 91 percent in 2005. House Republicans had an 85 percent party unity score in 2007, their

lowest since 1994. In the Senate, Democrats' average party unity score of 87 percent was up from 86 percent in 2006, but below their all-time high of 89 percent in 1999 and 2001. Senate Republicans' average unity score of 81 percent was their lowest since 1994.

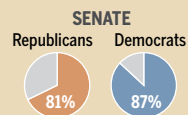
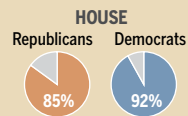


SENATE
