**243. Lee Nomination.** Confirmation of President Reagan's nomination of Rex E. Lee of Utah to be solicitor general of the United States. Confirmed 79-15: R 50-0; D 29-15 (ND 16-14, SD 13-1), July 31, 1981. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**244. HR 3982. Budget Reconciliation.** Adoption of the conference report on the bill to revise existing laws to reduce federal outlays by \$35.1 billion in fiscal 1982 and a total of \$130.6 billion in fiscal 1982-84. The reconciliation measure affected about 250 federal programs. Adopted (thus clearing the measure for the president) 80-14: R 49-1; D 31-13 (ND 17-13, SD 14-0), July 31, 1981. A "yea" vote was a vote supporting the president's position.

**245. HR 4331/HR 3982. Minimum Social Security Benefits/Budget Reconciliation.** Judgment of the Senate on the chair's ruling that the Moynihan, D-N.Y., motion to proceed to consideration of the bill (HR 4331) to amend the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 (HR 3982) to restore minimum Social Security benefits was out of order. Senate rules barred consideration of the bill on the day it was received. Ruling of the chair upheld 57-30: R 49-0; D 8-30 (ND 3-23, SD 5-7), July 31, 1981. A "yea" vote was a vote supporting the president's position.

**246. HR 4331/HR 3982. Minimum Social Security Benefits/Budget Reconciliation.** Byrd, D-W.Va., motion that the Senate adjourn for one minute, thus changing the legislative day to permit consideration (*see vote 245, above*) of the bill (HR 4331) to amend the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 (HR 3981) to restore minimum Social Security benefits. Motion rejected 37-49: R 0-47; D 37-2 (ND 26-1, SD 11-1), July 31, 1981.

**247. HR 4242. Tax Cuts.** Kennedy, D-Mass., motion to recommit to the conference committee the conference report on the tax cut bill with instructions to the Senate conferees to seek to reduce the revenue loss from certain crude oil windfall profits tax provisions. Motion rejected 20-55: R 5-37; D 15-18 (ND 12-10, SD 3-8), Aug. 3, 1981. A "nay" was a vote supporting the president's position.

**248. HR 4242. Tax Cuts.** Adoption of the conference report on the bill (known as the "Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981") to cut individual income tax rates by 25 percent across-the-board over 33 months; require that individual income taxes be adjusted, or indexed, annually to offset the effects of inflation, starting in 1985; allow accelerated depreciation for business investment in new assets; and provide special savings and investment incentives. Adopted 67-8: R 41-1; D 26-7 (ND 17-6, SD 9-1), Aug. 3, 1981. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.
