51. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Baker, R-Tenn., motion to table (kill) the Leahy, D-Vt., amendment to require congressional authorization for the introduction of combat troops in or over El Salvador. Motion agreed to 59-36: R 49-5; D 10-31 (ND 2-25, SD 8-6), April 4, 1984. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

52. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Kennedy, D-Mass., amendment to delete \$21 million in the bill for covert aid to Nicaraguan rebels. Rejected 30-61: R 4-47; D 26-14 (ND 23-4, SD 3-10), April 4, 1984. A "nay" was a vote supporting the president's position.

53. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Rudman, R-N.H., motion to table (kill) the Dodd, D-Conn., amendment to bar the use of covert funds for sabotage or terrorism in Nicaragua. Motion agreed to 47-43: R 44-7; D 3-36 (ND 0-27, SD 3-9), April 4, 1984.

54. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Stevens, R-Alaska, motion to table (kill) the Levin, D-Mich., amendment to bar the use of covert funds to overthrow a government of a country with which the U.S. has full diplomatic relations. Motion agreed to 51-44: R 46-8; D 5-36 (ND 0-28, SD 5-8), April 5, 1984. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

55. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Stevens, R-Alaska, motion to table (kill) the Sasser, D-Tenn., amendment to bar the use of Department of Defense operations and maintenance funds to convert temporary facilities in Honduras used for military exercises to permanent facilities. Motion agreed to 50-44: R 49-4; D 1-40 (ND 0-28, SD 1-12), April 5, 1984. A "yea" was a vote supporting the president's position.

56. H J Res 492. Department of Agriculture, Fiscal 1984 Urgent Supplemental Appropriations. Passage of the joint resolution to provide \$1,145,105,000 in fiscal 1984 emergency appropriations for food assistance programs of the Department of Agriculture, for assistance to El Salvador, covert aid to Nicaraguan rebels and for other purposes. Passed 76-19: R 53-1; D 23-18 (ND 9-18, SD 14-0), April 5, 1984. The president had requested \$90 million in food aid for 18 African nations, \$92,750,000 in military assistance to El Salvador and \$21 million in covert aid to Nicaraguan rebels.

57. HR 4169. Omnibus Reconciliation Act. Passage of the bill to reduce federal spending by \$8.2 billion from fiscal 1984-87 by delaying cost-of-living adjustments for federal retirees' benefits and veterans' compensation, and limiting and delaying federal civilian pay raises. Passed (thus cleared for the president) 67-26: R 50-2; D 17-24 (ND 13-15, SD 4-9), April 5, 1984.
