32．HR 2884．School to Work Opportunities／Passage．Pas－ sage of the bill to authorize $\$ 300$ million in fiscal 1995 and such sums as necessary through fiscal 2003 for a program to assist young people in the transition from school to the workplace．Passed 62 31：R 11－30；D 51－1（ND 39－1，SD 12－0），Feb．8，1994．（Before passage the Senate struck all after the enacting clause and inserted the text of S 1361 as amended．）A＂yea＂was a vote in support of the president＇s position．

33．Lawrence Nomination．Confirmation of M．Larry Law－ rence of California to be ambassador to Switzerland．Confirmed 79－16：R 32－10；D 47－6（ND 35－6，SD 12－0），Feb．8，1994．A＂yea＂ was a vote in support of the president＇s position．

34．HR 1804．Goals 2000：Educate America／Passage．Pas－ sage of the bill to authorize $\$ 422$ million for competitive grants for schools seeking to improve their performance，write into law six national education goals and establish tests and standards for elementary and secondary students．Passed 71－25：R 17－25；D 54－0 （ND 41－0，SD 13－0），Feb．8，1994．（Before passage the Senate struck all after the enacting clause and inserted the text of S 1150 as amended．）A＂yea＂was a vote in support of the president＇s position．

35．HR 3759．Fiscal 1994 Disaster Supplemental Appro－ priations／Rescissions．Byrd，D－W．Va．，motion to table（kill）the Kerrey，D－Neb．，amendment to rescind $\$ 94$ billion over five years from 54 programs．Motion agreed to 65－31：R 23－19；D 42－12（ND 31－9，SD 11－3），Feb．9，1994．（The motion also killed a Hatfield，R－

Ore．，substitute amendment to the Kerrey amendment，with $\$ 18.6$ billion in defense rescissions．）A＂yea＂was a vote in support of the president＇s position．

36．HR 3759．Fiscal 1994 Disaster Supplemental Appro－ priations／Statute of Limitations．D＇Amato，R－N．Y．，amendment to extend the statute of limitations for Resolution Trust Corporation civil actions for fraud and gross negligence until Dec．31，1995，or until the corporation goes out of existence，whichever is later． Adopted 95－0：R 42－0；D 53－0（ND 39－0，SD 14－0），Feb．9， 1994.

37．HR 3759．Fiscal 1994 Disaster Supplemental Appro－ priations／Electronic Records．Brown，R－Colo．，amendment to delete the money in the bill for the electronic communication record management activities of the Executive Office of the President． Rejected 44－51：R 39－1；D 5－50（ND 4－37，SD 1－13），Feb．10， 1994.

38．HR 3759．Fiscal 1994 Disaster Supplemental Appro－ priations／Disaster Checkoff．Craig，R－Idaho，motion to waive the budget act with respect to the Boren，D－Okla．，point of order against the Murkowski，R－Alaska，amendment for violating the Budget Act．The Murkowski amendment would express the sense of the Senate that the tax checkoff for presidential election funds should be replaced with a tax checkoff for federal disaster relief assistance．Motion rejected 37－58：R 36－4；D 1－54（ND 0－41，SD 1－ 13），Feb．10，1994．（A three－fifths majority（60）of the total Senate is required to waive the Budget Act．Subsequently，the chair upheld the Boren point of order，and the Murkowski amendment fell．）
