

# HOUSE

**1. Presidential Support.** Percentage of recorded votes cast in 2005 on which President Bush took a position and on which the member voted “yea” or “nay” in agreement with the president’s position. Failure to vote does not lower an individual’s score.

**2. Presidential Opposition.** Percentage of recorded votes cast in 2005 on which President Bush took a position and on which the member voted “yea” or “nay” in disagreement with the president’s position. Failure to vote does not lower an individual’s score.

**3. Participation in Presidential Support Votes.** Percentage of the 46 recorded House votes on which President Bush took a position and on which the member was present and voted “yea” or “nay.”

1 Rep. Doris Matsui, D-Calif., was sworn in March 10, 2005. The first vote for which she was eligible was vote 62. She was eligible for 42 presidential support votes in 2005.

2 Rep. John Campbell, R-Calif., was sworn in Dec. 7, 2005, to replace Republican Christopher Cox, who resigned effective Aug. 2. The first vote for which Campbell was eligible was vote 619; he was eligible for five presidential support votes in 2005. The last vote for which Cox was eligible was vote 453; he was eligible for 31 presidential support votes in 2005. His presidential support score was 90 percent; presidential opposition score, 10 percent; participation rate, 94 percent.

3 Rep. Randy “Duke” Cunningham, R-Calif., resigned effective Dec. 1, 2005. The last vote for which he was eligible was vote 608. He was eligible for 39 presidential support votes in 2005.

4 The Speaker votes only at his discretion, usually to break a tie or to emphasize the importance of a matter.

5 Rep. Jean Schmidt, R-Ohio, was sworn in Sept. 6, 2005, to replace Republican Rob Portman, who resigned effective April 29. The first vote for which Schmidt was eligible was vote 454; she was eligible for 15 presidential support votes in 2005. The last vote for which Portman was eligible was vote 150; he was eligible for 10 presidential support votes in 2005. His presidential support score was 100 percent; presidential opposition score, zero; participation rate, 100 percent.
