3. Participation in Presidential Support Votes. Percentage of the 70 recorded Senate votes in 2006 on which President Bush took a position and for which the senator was present and voted “yea” or “nay.”

¹ Rep. Brian P. Bilbray, R-Calif., was sworn in June 13, 2006, to replace Republican Randy “Duke” Cunningham, who resigned effective Dec. 1, 2005. The first vote for which Bilbray was eligible was vote 257; he was eligible for 28 presidential support votes in 2006.

² Rep. Mark Foley, R-Fla., resigned effective Sept. 30, 2006. The last vote for which he was eligible was vote 516; he was eligible for 35 presidential support votes in 2006.

³ The Speaker votes only at his discretion, usually to break a tie or to emphasize the importance of a matter.

⁴ Rep. Albio Sires, D-N.J., was sworn in Nov. 13, 2006, to replace Democrat Bob Menendez, who resigned effective Jan. 16, 2006. The first vote for which Sires was eligible was vote 517; he was eligible for five presidential support votes in 2006. Menendez was eligible for no House roll call votes in 2006.

⁵ Rep. Bob Ney, R-Ohio, resigned effective Nov. 3, 2006. The last vote for which he was eligible was vote 516; he was eligible for 35 presidential support votes in 2006.

⁶ Rep. Shelley Sekula-Gibbs, R-Texas, was sworn in Nov. 13, 2006, to replace Republican Tom DeLay, who resigned effective June 9, 2006. The first vote for which Sekula-Gibbs was eligible was vote 517; she was eligible for five presidential support votes in 2006. The last vote for which DeLay was eligible was vote 250; he was eligible for 12 presidential support votes in 2006. His presidential support score was 89 percent; presidential opposition score, 11 percent; participation rate, 75 percent.
